

### NAPFA Tests – P4 & P6 only

P4 and P6 students will be taking their NAPFA 1.6km Run and 5-Items tests in the month of April. The students will be scheduled for their respective tests.

Please note that CCAs will be cancelled on 13 April 2018 (Friday) as the teachers will be involved in the NAPFA Testing.

**a) NAPFA 1.6km run will be conducted in the morning during curriculum time.**

**b) 5-Items Test will be conducted in the afternoon after curriculum time on 13 April 2018 (Friday) for Primary 4 & 6 students.**

The NAPFA Re-tests will be conducted in May 2018 for pupils who have missed or failed the tests.

### International Friendship Day

The commemoration of International Friendship Day will be held in Canossa Convent Primary School on 5 April 2018. This commemorative day aims to foster the spirit of friendship and respect for people of different nationalities in Singapore.

This year, the theme for International Friendship Day is Celebrating the ASEAN Community. There will be an assembly programme on 5 April. Displays with information about ASEAN countries will be put up near the Values Wall. Pupils will get to enjoy varied activities during recess time and participate in the learning activities conducted during CCE periods.

### Earth Day

The school will commemorate Earth Day on 19 April 2018 this year. During that week, a few events will be held in school to increase the awareness and appreciation of the Earth's natural environment.

An assembly talk will be conducted to create an awareness on the importance of energy conservation and booths will be set up during recess to encourage students and staff to write down their pledges to commit to save energy.

### Primary 1 Registration Exercise – Sibling Survey for Phase 1 Registration of Children for Admission to Primary One in 2019

All students have been given a Survey Form for Sibling Priority (Phase 1) for the 2018 Primary 1 Registration Exercise. This is a priority phase for siblings of students who are currently studying in Canossa Convent Primary School.

The child to be registered must be a Singapore Citizen/Singapore Permanent Resident and must be born between **2 January 2012 and 1 January 2013 (both dates inclusive)**. Children who are eligible for Phase 1 need not come down to the school personally to register. We seek your co-operation to complete the Survey Form and submit it through your child's form teacher by **Friday, 6 April 2018**. All survey forms, including NIL returns, must be submitted.

### Health Tips

Singapore has one of the highest myopia rates in the world. One in five Singapore kids are myopic when they start primary school. This is a cause for alarm if left untreated. Some of the ways that you can help to control myopia are:

- Engage your child in more outdoor activities as the natural light outdoor helps to release a chemical called Dopamine in the eye that can stop the development of myopia.
- Limit your child's screen time to control the exposure to blue light and radiation absorption. The blue light emissions from digital devices is especially detrimental to children, causing eye strain and in the long run, damage the retina.

An active and healthy lifestyle goes a long way in caring for your child's vision.

### Gentle reminders

The school would like to continue to help your child grow to be more independent and responsible. If your child has forgotten to bring his/her books/assignments/personal items to school, do note that you need not make a special trip to school to hand them to him/her. If it is an urgent item that needs to be submitted, your child's teachers will contact you. Do remind your child to pack the school bag daily so he/she only brings the necessary items to school.
